From the Rector - Fall 2020

For what a long time we have had to be apart! We have interrupted so many of the rhythms of what we assumed were normal and best in our daily lives, including our faith and worship life. The COVID-19 pandemic has provided us a lot of time to despair, to reflect, and to look at what is truly important in our lives.

Now we prepare to return to some form of regathered worship and mission. Our church building will finally be

rush to get all things up and running, but an intentional measured process forward. We will start by having limited office hours and offering Sunday worship. Our worship numbers will be restricted, so we have devised a plan to meet the conditions we have to live up to for safe-distancing, contact tracing, safe liturgical practices and so on. Our plan for Sunday live worship is outlined in this newsletter. It is how we will begin and adjustments will be made as we go. We are on a journey forward, not at a destination.

Plans for limited gatherings of parish groups and ministries are in process. We do not anticipate inviting groups back into the church building until late autumn at the earliest and will communicate with individual group leaders.

I do look forward to be able to gather with folks in the church for worship and prayer as we re-open on Sunday, September 27 when we will celebrate the Festival of St. Michael and All Angels also known as Michaelmas. However, I must encourage you to reflect on your health, your concerns, and your personal comfort level during this pandemic as you make your decision about returning to gathered live worship, or not. We will also look to create opportunities for personal visits as the situation allows.

Lastly, I want to thank the efforts of all our staff and lay leaders to keep everything connected and for being so supportive and responsive during what has been a very fluid time of change

and reaction filled with unknowns. Thanks too, to all of you who have supported us with prayer and continued financial support during this time.

Treasurer's Report

Although we are very fortunate at St. George's to have many parishioners on Preauthorized Giving (PAG) and others who have made sure that their contributions have made it to the Church, the financial impact of COVID-19 is starting to take its toll on our finances. Although the Workside Early Childhood Education Centre has resumed operations since mid-July, the Church is still without much of its rental income and other rental opportunities may not be available for some time.

To help with our cash flow, we had suspended our DM&M payments to the diocese. Starting in July, we have started to make those payments again, so we will not be in arrears at year end. The diocese, which administers our payroll, has applied and been approved for the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS) in every month that it has been offered. This helps to offset some of our salary expenses.


Although our income is off by \$18,000 from this time last year, it is off budget by \$72,000. It is important to note that the rent received from Workside does

not show up as income, but rather as an offsetting expense. Even though the Church is closed, most of the expenses remain the same. Our expenses are about \$6,000 higher than this time last year and \$25,000 over budget (remember the Workside revenue that we missed while they were closed would decrease our expenses). Our deficit is about \$13,000 larger than at this time last year and is \$95,000 larger than was budgeted.

As a parish we have some work to do to help St. George's recover from COVID-19. With the Church opening in September we hope to see an increase in our revenues.

Update from the Wardens

Looking at the calendar, it's hard to believe the community of St. George's has been apart from each other for over five months. And yet, we have managed to meet together in creative ways. Now we are seeing the light at the end of the tunnel with the resumption of services in a scaled-back form as of September 27. I'm sure we are all feeling some relief that our routines are slowly starting to return to some kind of normalcy.

Council and Corporation have remained connected through regular Zoom meetings, and continue to insure that all aspects of St. George's are managed and cared for, despite the building being closed to all but a select few (clergy, office personnel, sexton). Here are a few highlights we would like to bring to your attention:

1. C&C endorsed the participation in two outreach projects, one local and one international. A one-time donation was made to the Guelph Community Foundation to support COVID-19 relief efforts in the local community. In June, we had two special visitors joining us. On the 7th, Will Postma,

Executive Director of PWRDF, attended our Zoom Coffee Hour and spoke about the current fundraising project assisting communities in Africa through the Emergency Food Relief with the Canadian Food Grains Bank, The All Mothers and Children Count program, and the Kilwa Emergency Response. It was a pleasure having the Primate of Canada, Archbishop Linda Nicholls, attend our "virtual" church service on June 28, as well as staying for the Zoom coffee time to chat about various issues including the PWRDF. We are encouraging our parishioners to consider making a donation of any amount to this worthwhile project. As in the past, any donations will be matched by the federal government.

2. Volunteers have continued with an all-parishioner "phone-blast", checking in with our members during this Covid time. All reports indicate that this has been a very valued and worthwhile effort. Thank you to those who have been doing the phoning.

3. A team of folks has prepared two meals for Saturday Night Suppers, one in June, and one in August.

4. A sub-committee of Corporation has begun preparations for re-opening the church, tentatively set for September 27.

5. Upon urgent recommendation of the Building and Grounds committee, Corporation unanimously passed a motion on June 16 to replace the roof on Mitchell Hall. This motion was subsequently passed by Council on June 19, via an e-vote. Building and Grounds was of the opinion that the work on the roof

could no longer be delayed for fear that the integrity of the roof might be compromised. Further leakage might weaken the structural elements in the roof and adjoining walls and this could become a safety hazard. As per protocol, Building and Grounds sought out quotes and recommended Centrix (General Contractor) to oversee the project. The cost will be less than the original quote of \$74,500 due to the presence of the underlying cement roof structure. Normally the protocol for an expenditure over \$15,000 would require a Vestry meeting, however due to restrictions caused by Covid-19, Synod Council and the Bishop suspended the requirement for a Special Vestry approval. Niagara Diocese expedited approval of the project which began in mid-August. By the time you read this newsletter the project should be completed. We want to assure parishioners that this decision was not made in haste, and after much discussion and debate it was decided to tap into the Endowment Reserves. As one would say, we have accumulated savings for a rainy day, and we have definitely arrived at our rainy day.
