Holy Week and Easter 2025

From the Rector

As I write this letter today, I'm reminded that the word 'Lent' comes from the old English word Lenten, meaning "spring," which is not only a seasonal reference to Easter, but also an invitation for a springtime of the soul. However, I find myself more closely identifying with the following drawing from Sandra Boynton.

This has been a long winter, filled with overcast skies, the polar vortex, and more days of freezing rain and snow than I care to remember. I used to love playing in the snow; that is, until I had to shovel it. But now I find myself aching for the signs of spring – aching to see those crocuses fully emerge – aching to see signs of new life emerging from God's creation all around us. Because, in many ways, these signs of new life remind us of what has already happened, and continues to happen every day as God brings about the renewal and restoration of this world.

Sometimes we as the church, particularly the North American church, think of the resurrection as an event that occurred in the past and is limited to the past. Now true enough, the resurrection of Jesus from the dead occurred in the past and is God's own testimony against death. But the resurrection of Jesus is also what empowers us for living. Because if we want to truly live, then we need to embrace what it means to live the resurrected life – a life full of love, meaning, and purpose. For the good news of Easter is not only that Jesus Christ has been raised from the dead and is alive, but also that the power of the resurrection can transform our lives as well.



Throughout this season of Lent and into Easter, we as the church celebrate that there is new life and new possibilities for you and I right there and right now in this world. Our Holy Week services begin on Palm Sunday, April 13th when we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem with a procession of palm branches with services at 8:30 am and 10:30 am.

Then on Maundy Thursday, April 17th, we'll gather at 7:00 pm to remember the last supper and Jesus' mandate (mandatum became maundy) to "love one another as I have loved you." After celebrating the Eucharist, our liturgy will include stripping the altar of all furnishings to remind us of how the soldiers stripped Christ of his garments prior to his crucifixion.

We then gather on Good Friday, April 18th, at 10:30 am to hear the proclamation of Christ's Passion and reflect upon his sacrifice for us. The tone is solemn, but not somber, for our emphasis is on the victory of the cross. We will then mark the beginning of the fifty days of Easter on Sunday April 20th at 8:30 am and 10:30 am.

Holy Week provides an opportunity for us to encounter our most powerful and transformative liturgies. They are central to our faith and our walk with Christ and I strongly encourage you to plan on attending as many of these services as you are able. So as we experience new birth and new life around us, it is my hope and prayer that you will find your faith strengthened, your hope renewed, and that you will be blessed with His peace and joy throughout the Easter season!

- We've hosted 2 Saturday Night Suppers, bringing a nourishing, warm meal to our community's most vulnerable members
- Our Book Club continues to meet monthly, both in-person and online.
- Chi Rho continues to regularly meet at All Saints Church.
- Our "Take Heart" ministry began operating on Wednesday afternoons and Thursday evenings, opening our church to anyone who wants to come inside to quietly enjoy the beautiful nave.
- Our Vestry meeting took place in late February, with Jim Squires and Grace Gomashie joining the Warden team! A huge thank you to Rani Varkey, Giesela Goetz and Bruce Carrick for their dedicated service to St. George's over the last number of years.
- We celebrated Shrove Tuesday with a Pancake Supper with approximately 125 people in attendance.
- We had our first "Zoom Church" when a snowstorm on February 19th made it much safer to stay home.
- Adults of all ages enjoyed a Square Dance Social, called by Cadence Beck.
- The Community Closet, also organized by our Young Adult Ministry, was launched and is stocked with items that might be needed by those in need who come to the church in search of food, warm clothing or other items, particularly when other service providers aren't open.
- Harry Oussoren provided Church Leadership with fire evacuation training.
- The plans for upgrading our sound and video equipment are underway the contract has been signed and we await the equipment to arrive!
- We hosted our Spring Soup & Buns lunch raising funds for our Saturday Night Supper ministry.
- Another Newcomers' Lunch took place in late March with 8 new parishioners in attendance!
- Our time as refugee sponsors for the Koujar family is winding up as they approach their first anniversary in Canada.
- Victor's Zoom Lent course was a huge hit with over 30 people attending on Zoom each Wednesday in Lent.

Treasurer's Report

The amount received from Identified Givers year to date up to February is up \$17K from February of last year, with open collections being about the same. Total offerings are down, however, \$61,625 of that was from a special one time gift. Without the special gifts, total offerings are up \$17K from February 2024. Parking revenue is similar to last year making the increase to total revenue \$17K without the special gifts.

On the expense side, Maintenance costs are up mainly due to an increment in Insurance costs, Repairs, and Contracts & Inspections. At this time of year, it can be more of a timing issue than an actual increase in the costs. Expenses for Office & Accounting are higher, however the Audit bill was paid in February this year and was paid later last year, other expenses are similar year over year. Building Recovery Costs – Other Users (shown in our budget as a negative expense rather than as income) is up from last year as rentals increase.

Our Expenses over Revenue are higher than last year at -\$96.7K, however much of that is due to the special gift.

How can you help?

The best thing you can do for St. George's is to make regular, generous offerings to the church. You might consider Pre-Authorized Giving if you haven't already. Simply fill out the form (download it from our website or contact the office for one) and your gift will come directly out of your bank account. No more having to remember an envelope every Sunday!


